A bill currently being drafted in the US Senate will pre-empt the Environmental Protection Agency from regulating carbon dioxide. While a final draft of the legislation is not yet available, it is anticipated that only the power generation sector of the economy will initially be covered. The bill may also provide a hard dollar "collar" on the price of carbon.

We expect to see details of the proposal next week. The definitive information in the proposal may be a good inclusion in corporate Q&A books distributed to senior managers in anticipation of questions at annual meetings.
