From Sunday, August 8 through Wednesday, August 11th Charleston, West Virginia hosted the 95th annual conference of the National Association of State Auditors, Controllers and Treasurers (NASACT).

The second day of the conference was opened by Gene Dodaro, the Comptroller General of the US Government Accountability Office (GAO). Dodaro discussed trends from the US GAO's recently updated strategic plan for serving the Congress and related GAO work. One particular trend of interest discussed 'threats confronting US National Security interests' and how some consider energy security and climate change as part of the emerging threat.

Dodaro's presentation was followed by BNY Mellon's Jim Balsan presenting on potential opportunities that climate change activities and legislation might create for the states and the possible impact on companies.
