

## 2009 HIGHLIGHTS IN MASSACHUSETTS

With the founding of Boston Safe Deposit and Trust Company in 1875, our company began building its reputation as a trusted provider of safekeeping and other fiduciary services to New England's wealthy merchants and ship owners. Over time, these services grew to include asset management and custody operations as The Boston Company ushered the firm through the latter part of the 20th century.

The Boston Company's success in building a national and international reputation led to a series of acquisitions. In 1993, it was acquired by Mellon Financial Corp., which was beginning its transformation from a retail bank to a diversified global financial firm. In 2007, Mellon's merger with The Bank of New York created a truly global powerhouse and the BNY Mellon that we know today.

Boston continues to be a strategic center for BNY Mellon's key business lines: securities servicing, asset management and wealth management. The heritage of excellence, innovation and world class client service that defined Boston Safe Deposit and Trust more than 130 years ago still shines in BNY Mellon's employees today.



**Financial Support: Best Buddies International, Inc.**

Founded in 1989, the mission of Best Buddies International is to establish a global volunteer movement that creates opportunities for one-to-one friendships, integrated employment and leadership development for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDDs). BNY Mellon has partnered with Best Buddies Massachusetts since 2008 and provided a \$75,000 grant in 2009 to support a program that matches skilled and qualified individuals with businesses looking for dedicated employees.

The grant helped about 1,000 individuals with IDD develop critical social skills needed for successful integrated employment. Best Buddies also received a \$25,000 sponsorship for its 2009 High Gear Gala, and a team of 16 employees participated in a 100-mile ride, raising \$10,000 and company matching dollars.

**POWERING POTENTIAL:**

**Community Partnership: Morgan Memorial Goodwill**

Morgan Memorial Goodwill Industries, a BNY Mellon community partner since 1993, provides job training and related services to individuals with disabilities and other barriers to help them achieve independence and dignity through work. In 2009, Community Partnership teams collected more than \$10,000 worth of goods and volunteered 80 hours at Morgan Memorial, earning a company match for the charity. Throughout the year, volunteers conducted a clothing drive and sorted clothing in the donated goods distribution center.

Morgan Memorial Goodwill Industries' BNY Mellon Academy for Girls, funded through the BNY Mellon charitable giving program, serves girls from low-income families living in Boston's inner-city neighborhoods. As a result of grant support, individual employee contributions and company matches through our Community Partnership Program, more than 100 young women benefited from a variety of academic assistance, leadership training and empowerment programs and workshops.
